CHARTERS TOWERS RURAL CRISIS SUMMIT

The Charter Towers Rural Crisis Summit was held at the Charters Towers Golf Club on Monday 31st August 2015. There were over 350 people in attendance, with people flowing over to standing room only inside and outside the room.

The meeting was chaired by Shane Knuth, State Member for Dalrymple and Robbie Katter, Member for Mt Isa, calling for government to do more to assist people in need, especially through increased water infrastructure and debt reconstruction measures.

A host of other rural advocates - including Winton grazier Charlie Phillott, Aussie Helpers co-founder Brian Egan, Cate Stuart (formerly of Mt Morris station at Charleville) and QUT economists Mark McGovern and Ben Rees - also addressed the conference.

Charlie Phillott who was featured on Channel 9's 60 minutes on 30th August 2015, spoke along with ANZ CEO and admitted that the bank had badly handled Charlies Phillott's case. Consequently the bank will reverse the foreclosure proceedings and return the property to the Phillott's.

Bill Bryne, Minister for Agriculture and Fisheries followed, he did not make any commitment and made it clear that the government would not intervene in commercial relationships.

Barry Egan from Aussie Helpers told of his eviction from his property and subsequent depressive illness prior to founding Aussie Helpers. Cate Stewart also related her story after being evicted from Mt Marrow.

Federal Member for Kennedy, Bob Katter gave the closing address and encouraged people to continue to fight for change and justice in rural property.

South Australian Parliament representatives visit region

Recently Western Downs Regional Council Mayor Ray Brown welcomed representatives from the Parliament of South Australia's Natural Resources Committee to the region as part of their Central Queensland tour.

The delegation visited Dalby and Chinchilla meeting with the Mayor, Council representatives, and key community groups to gain an insight and appreciation of the impacts, opportunities, and challenges that the coal seam gas industry's expansion has brought to the Western Downs and Surat Basin regions.

These insights into how the energy sector has transformed the local economy and the future of our communities, as well as how Council continues to work alongside the CSG industry in our region will be taken into consideration by the Parliament of South Australia's Natural Resources Committee inquiry into Unconventional Gas.

News In Brief

DOGWOOD CREEK BRIDGE OFFICIALLY OPENED

After months of planning, preparation and construction the newly replaced Dogwood Creek Bridge on Hookswood-Pelham Road, Miles, officially opened to the public last month. The impressive 25-metre single span steel truss bridge, originally manufactured by the Department of Defence, replaces the old timber bridge built by the community in 1943. By repurposing the steel truss bridge Council kept the cost of the replacement project down and delivered the community a more sustainable and reliable asset during heavy rain events.

CHINCHILLA AERODROME UPGRADES

The Chinchilla Aerodrome has recently reopened after the first phase of a \$4.7 million rehabilitation project, was completed on schedule and on budget. The project, designed to enhance the operational capabilities of the facility was delivered by Council, QGC Pty Limited, and Ostwald Bros. The much-needed upgrades, funded by QGC, has significantly improved the reliability and safety of the runway and taxiway for aircraft and regular users of the aerodrome. MEMOIRS OF THE MILES HISTORICAL VILLAGE, EDITION 13

We would like to offer our sincere apologies for the spelling mistakes and incorrect information in the September edition of the Murilla Community Newsletter



In 1984, Brian and Trish Ford travelled to Brisbane to present an application for a Bicentenary grant project. Out of 350 applications the Miles project was one of the fifteen accepted, with a grant of \$58,250 allocated to establish a unique showcase of the geological and anthropological features of the Great Artesian Basin, from prehistoric occupation to the last 200 years of European Settlement. Brian and Trish were to be

congratulated on their successful application. In 1984 a grant to assist local Museums, valued at \$1,200 was received from the Queensland Museum.

In January 1985, the Miles and District Historical Village was among 10 Queensland Museums to receive an award for their high standard and contribution to the local community from Queensland Art's Minister, Mr McKechnie.

Also in 1985 the Miles and District Historical Society, became an Incorporated Association.

The Governor and Lady Campbell visited the Museum on the 4th September 1985. Lady Campbell was presented with teaspoons as a memento of their visit.

The Commonwealth Bank purchased the land occupied by the old Winchome building and offered the building to the Miles and District Historical Society for removal.

Don Duffel, Alan Davis, Doris Davidson and Lloyd Bell removed the awning prior to the building being moved to the Museum by Chappel removalists, where it was to become the Bank. "Lloyd" the electricity Authority never did find out who disconnected the wires. Removal costs were \$2,295 and painting by Paul Morris was \$1380. Alterations and repairs were carried out by Les Rose and Co, at a cost of over \$14,300. The fireproof door and fittings cost over \$1,500.

It was a strange coincidence that Les Rose spent his early apprenticeship years

working for Giles and Co when they built the building for Winchombe Carson, and he was now many years later working on the same building.

On the 14th of September 1985, The Australian Bank of Commerce, a replica of that bank built in 1911, was opened by Mr Jack Griffiths, Commonwealth Bank Manager of Branch Operations. One of the highlights of the opening was the 'HOLD' by Ned Kelly and gang, also the Steve Hart gang of highwaymen.

GARDEN NOTES

BY EMMA EISING - MURILLA GARDEN GROUP



October is upon us and the weather is warming up. It is great in the garden this time of year with the extended daylight hours, the warm soil and the sun, bringing everything to life. Watering has commenced, that is if you have a good supply. Otherwise weeding and mulching is essential, hopefully you have got on top of it by now, as soon as spring starts the weeds seem to pop up everywhere.

It is also time to dead head any spent blooms. Dead heading is simply just taking of any spent flowers, by either just snapping them off by hand or by cutting. Regular dead heading not only keeps it looking attractive but also keeps the plant from going to seed and therefore focusing its energy into flowering, resulting in healthier plants and continued blooms. The second bloom should last longer than the first.

Every year around the beginning of September, when the chances of frost are minimal, we cut our lawn back to the lowest height on the lawn mower. This is a form of dethatching or scalping. We carry all the dead grass away and put it around outer trees for mulch. When we do this we also fertilise the lawn with cow manure and then aerate it, to allow better water penetration. We have a couch lawn so if we don't do this it becomes too thick over the summer months and can get fungal problems. So at this time in October I now have a super healthy lawn. This however invites lawn grubs so I am on the alert for them as they can take over very quickly.

IN THE VEGGIE PATCH



I have found a great tip for growing celery. Previously when I have grown celery, the stems were tough and stringy. This year I tried something different, with great success. I found some left over poly sheeting in the shed and formed a tube out of it. Then placed it around a couple of the celery plants in the garden and within five days, not only had these ones grown twice as fast as the uncovered plants but the stems are a beautiful pale green colour like the shop

ones they were also super tasty and juicy.

You could probably also use PVC drain pipe. You can see in the picture the four I covered up 5 days earlier.

It is time to plant; sweet potato, corn, beans, leeks, lettuces, spring onions, squash, zucchini, chillies and capsicum. Get those fruit fly traps out, to protect your tomatoes and other susceptible plants.

Telehealth services for the WHOLE COMMUNITY



The Health-e-Regions project is supported by QGC to help provide rural health services delivery to the towns of Dalby, Chinchilla, Miles, Wandoan and Tara. The project aims to promote and support access to specialist health services through the installation of equipment and training of staff to conduct telehealth consultations.

What is telehealth?

Telehealth is the use of digital technology to provide healthcare by connecting patients to specialists in separate locations. A high-speed, secure video link enables you to connect with your healthcare provider for assessments and follow-up visits.

During a telehealth consultation, you are able to see, hear and talk to your healthcare provider on a television screen and they will be able to see, hear, and talk to you. You can even bring your family with you to your consultation.

Telehealth case study

A five-year-old boy in Miles requires specialist treatment in Brisbane on a monthly basis This necessitated in at least a two day trip for the family, with his siblings missing school and his parents missing work. The alternative was to separate the family unit and have him travel with just one parent; however the ideal treatment included all family members.

With a well-established telehealth program operating out of the Royal Children's Hospital (now the Lady Cilento Children's Hospital), the treating specialist was approached to conduct a consultation via telehealth. She was initially reluctant and sceptical of the idea, but agreed to "give it a try". After the first session she was converted to a telehealth believer and all consultations since have been conducted by video conferencing.

Parent's comment

"The difference to us has just been amazing. You miss out on things because you have to go away for this one appointment; the kids have missed out on things at school and that type of thing. It's not also just the big impact of driving and being away, and cost, it's the little things you miss out on as well. The appointment doesn't become your life; your life carries on around the appointment. You're able to work it into your time and life and schedule much easier.

It's very simple to use. They ring you, so you sit down and wait for the call. It's so simple."

African Boxthorn is a spiny shrub from South Africa. Introduced to Australia in the mid 1800s as a hedge plant, it has since spread into pastures, neglected areas, roadsides, railways and waterways. It produces a dense thicket armed with spines that can form an impenetrable barrier to domestic stock. African Boxthorn has been recognised in Australia as a Weed of National Significance (WoNS). African boxthorn can be an aggressive invader of pastures, roadsides and reserves. It forms impenetrable, sharp spined

thickets, which can cause problems along fence lines and inhibit the movement of stock. Dense infestations will reduce the usability of pasture land and hinder mustering. Dead plants can still be a problem to stock and tyres, as plants remain spiky for up to 20 years if not burnt.

Declaration details: African Boxthorn is a declared Class 2 plant under the Land Protection (Pest and Stock Route Management) Act 2002. Declaration requires landholders to control declared pests on the land under their control. **Herbicide control:** After herbicide application, African boxthorn plants often lose their leaves and appear dead but may still recover and produce new leaves. This can occur a number of times before the plant is properly dead, especially if a root-absorbed herbicide is used. **Foliar spray:** Overall spray the bushes to the point of run-off. Optimum time for spraying is February—May, when plants are actively growing. Do not spray during hot, dry summer periods. **Basal bark treatment:** Carefully spray around the base of each stem to a height of 30–40 cm above ground level. **Cut stump treatment:** Cut each stem off as close to the ground as possible and immediately (within 15 seconds) apply the herbicide mixture liberally to the cut surface. **Root application:** Apply one of the residual herbicides to the soil between the base of the plant and the drip line, preferably when the soil is wet or rain is expected.

Rate: 1 part glyphosate to 1.5 parts water Comments: Stem injection or stem scrape

Herbicide group: M, Inhibitors of EPSP synthase






