

Biosecurity planning to protect your property

Nobody should ever enter anyone else's property without permission. Unauthorised entry at places where animals are kept can pose biosecurity risks, such as the spread of diseases from infected people to animals and the spread of diseases and Limited Drought Funding pests carried on people (e.g. clothing, footwear), vehicles or equipment moving onto a property.

An amendment to Queensland biosecurity regulation came into effect on 26 April 2019 to address potential biosecurity risks of unauthorised entry to places where animals are kept.

Under the amendment, anybody that enters your property must comply with your biosecurity management plan when they enter or leave and while they are on your

To support the security of your property under this regulation, primary producers are encouraged to:

- ensure you are registered as a biosecurity entity with Biosecurity Queensland
- have an up-to-date biosecurity management plan in place for your property that aligns to the biosecurity regulation:
 - If you already have a biosecurity plan in place, a checklist is available to support you in upgrading this plan to ensure it aligns to the
 - If you don't have a plan in place, a template for developing a biosecurity management plan which aligns to the regulation is available from Animal Health Australia
- place a sign at the front gate and other access points that:
 - advises a biosecurity management plan is in place
 - tells visitors how they can contact you during business hours
- keep all doors, gates and other entry points locked when staff are not present
- keep records of audits, staff training and biosecurity procedures up-to-date and at hand
- consider installing security measures such as CCTV video surveillance
- carefully consider applicants and terms of employment before hiring new staff.

Biosecurity management plan property signs

If you have a biosecurity management plan for your property, we recommended that you erect signs near or at entrances to management areas on your property to alert visitors of their biosecurity obligations.

It is an offence for someone entering, being present on, or leaving a management area on your property to not comply with the biosecurity management plan for your property.



How to manage money while looking for work

Centrelink can help you stay in control of your finances while you look for work.

Changes to your income

While you look for work your income might change. Make a plan, so you have enough money set aside to pay your bills while your income is low. Remember to think about your regular bills as well as other expenses you have. For example:

- mortgage, corporate fees and rates
- car registration and insurance

Planning your expenses

If you think you can't pay your bills on time, talk to the hardship teams at companies, such as:

- your utility providers
- other places you have loans with

They may want to help you and suspend, reduce or waive debt repayments depending on your situation.

Talk to someone

Another place to get help with your planning is the National Debt Helpline. They provide a free, confidential and independent financial counselling service. Financial Counselling Australia provides a free, confidential and independent service. You can find a financial counsellor on the Financial Counselling Australia website. They can suggest ways to:

- negotiaté repayment options
- get help from other services such as a gambling helpline, personal counselling or community legal aid They can also provide advice about:
- repaying debts
- debt collectors or debt recovery through the courts



keeping the community buses on the road!



Community Update



July 2019

Origin's seismic energy source vehicle was on show at the the Miles Show, providing the opportunity for our technical team to explain what it does and how it works. You may spot it, and others like it, working in the area at the moment.

Several local business people, Miles Historical Society volunteers and visitors to town jumped onboard our 'Origin of Gas' Community Tour recently, taking an inside look at our Condabri Central gas processing and water treatment facility. If you missed it, there's more tours coming up on Thursday August 1 and Thursday September 5, departing from the Miles Historical Village.

We're about to start working with Monadelphous, constructing the Talinga Orana Gas Gathering station (we call it 'TOGGS') between Miles and Chinchilla. Monadelphous will the deliver civil, structural, mechanical, piping and electrical instrumentation work on the project that will allow us to maximise gas production from the Talinga and Orana gas field.

Last month we talked about a new development package just north of Miles called Condabri North Stage Two. You may hear it called "DP007" around town. We've started - and the plan is to drill up to 19 new wells around Hookswood Road and Myall Park Roat.

As part of this work, we'll also be drilling under Dogwood Creek – using a horizontal directional drilling technique - to connect the gathering system back to our Condabri facility. We use horizontal directional drilling regularly in other places to safely drill under roads and water courses. Minimising disruption for the community where possible has been our focus for this package of work, and we will remain in touch with landholders and neighbours as we progress.

Looking ahead, as part of our ongoing exploration and appraisal activity, we're planning to drill, stimulate and test two wells targeting deeper underground coal formations south of Miles later in the year.

GARDEN CLUB TIPS & TRICKS

Quick and Easy Naan Bread or Pizza Base

Ingredients Greek-style yoghurt Self-raising flour

Method

- 1. Combine 200g Greek-style yoghurt and 1 3/4 cups (260g) self-raising flour in a bowl until a soft dough

- Divide the caramel popcorn among the cones and place on the lined tray. Place in the fridge for 1 hour or until set.
- Place chocolate in a microwave-safe bowl. Heat in the microwave on Medium, stirring every 30 seconds with a metal spoon, for 1 minute or until the chocolate melts and is smooth.
- Drizzle a little chocolate over each cone. Place in the fridge for 10 minutes or until set. Serve.


