

The Noonga Community would like to express their condolences to Mary, Barry, Sheryl, Clancy and Henry Sinnamon on the passing of Ray - Husband, Father, Father in Law and Grandfather. A memorial service was held at Noonga on Sunday 12 November as part of the regular Presbyterian Church service which Ray and Mary attended regularly. The Noonga Hall was overflowing with family, neighbours, and friends, a testament to Ray's life. The family had decorated the hall with tributes to Ray, including milking and farming bits and pieces, sporting items such as Jackson cricket scoring books and trophies and photos. Sons Barry and Graham spoke the Eulogy covering all areas including his love of sport, family, Santa cows, landcare, grasses and weeds and dung beetles. A point of interest was the responsibility placed on Ray, then 18 years old, by his parents to run Charmana when they retired to Calounda in 1950. Ray and his sister Margaret (20 years old) continued to farm for another 6 years. The trend seems to be away from sewing as in clothing and there are many wonderful crafts and needlework skills that can be applied to accessories and soft furnishings to make you the proud owner/exhibitor of a statement piece.
