

QGC Supports local veterinary business establish a Wildlife Rescue Service in Chinchilla

In response to strong community need and a desire to build and utilise local expertise, QGC has worked closely with Chinchilla Vet Services to set up and deliver a wildlife rescue and rehabilitation service.

The service, which opened 1st May, is the culmination of six months of work to ensure the local service has the appropriate infrastructure, resources and the required services to meet the level of care and support required under Queensland's Nature Conservation Act.

The intent in establishing this service locally was to build the skills in-house with a local vet, to help to increase the community's capacity for treating wildlife and to open up new networks and opportunities with other specialised wildlife sanctuaries and carers in and around the region.

QGC's Environment Team worked with Chinchilla Vet Services to identify any gaps in their services and capabilities – and we also helped to upskill local staff and provided wildlife handling training through a third-party provider.

QGC was proud of the work it has done with the Chinchilla Vet Service, which demonstrated the company's commitment to building capability and creating opportunities for local business in the region.

QGC's commitment included:

- Giving the vet service a purpose-built triage centre,
- Glass indoor and outdoor enclosures for reptiles.
- Bird recovery and flight aviaries,
- Macropod enclosures,
- A dedicated 4WD vehicle for emergency call outs and medical equipment and medicines.



Chinchilla Vet Services owner Kara Knudsen said the cost of setting up a facility, similar to the new centre was prohibitive without the support from QGC.

"You need specific wildlife training and the right recovery facilities for the many different species we will see, she said.

"QGC was very generous and paid for the relocation of all equipment to our premises.

"It is great for our business and our staff to be given the opportunity to deliver this service in locally in Chinchilla, while we have invested heavily in training staff ourselves, QGC have also been very generous in providing staff training in wildlife care.

"With our new set-up we have added capability to assist other organisations in the area to care for wildlife found on their properties, she said.



QGC Communities Fund - NOW OPEN

The QGC Communities Fund provides grants between \$10,000 and \$40,000 to community based organisations in the Western Downs and Gladstone Regional Council areas. The Fund is now open for applications and closes at 5pm, 31st August 2018.

- 2. Select complete your Child Care Subsidy assessment task
- 3. Work through the steps. You'll need to give us new information and confirm your details in the prefilled sections

You will need to Provide:

- 1. An estimate of your family income for 2018-2019
- 2. Your and your partner's activity level
- 3. The school status of your child
- 4. Confirmation of your child's enrolment details
- 5. Confirm the information before you submit

It's important you do this as soon as possible. If you don't, you will have to pay your child care fees in full.





Miles Police were honoured to be part of the enjoyment of this year's NAIDOC Week celebrations. The OIC Miles wishes to congratulate the participants and organisers for an event definitely worth remembering.

Miles and Condamine locals may have noticed the State Wide Traffic Task Force and Roadside Drug Testing Unit out in this area in the last few weeks. These units are instrumental in the detection and prevention of traffic offences, including drink and drug driving. The OIC Miles Police is disappointed to announce that these units have already detected a number of drug drivers in our area, and some Miles locals were charged with drug driving.

Miles Police would also like to alert all Condamine and Miles locals of Operation Wake-up that will be conducted at the end of July 2018 along our highways. This operation is part of a nationwide operation that will target road safety, and also Heavy Vehicles and heavy vehicle-related offences. 

Wombats, watermelons and white gums will become the star attractions of Chinchilla's brand new multi-million dollar Parklands, with completion expected for early 2019.

Spanning 4.2 hectares in the heart of town, the Parklands will celebrate the unique identity of Chinchilla: from the discovery of the 3.5-million-year-old mega-wombat Diprotodon, to the region's sweet connection to all things watermelon.

If you're planning a family fun day or a Sunday drive, make the Parklands your next stop. Uncover ancient artefacts hidden in the Megafauna Discovery Space; share Dreamtime stories in the Aboriginal yarning circle; explore Chinchilla's rich railway heritage; and

Greek Yogurt Breakfast Bar



Serves 6 Ingredients

1 1/2 Cups Plain Greek Yogurt 3 tbs Maple Syrup 1/2 Cup Blueberry Pecan Granola 1/2 Cup Blueberries 3 to 4 Strawberries - Sliced

Method

- Line a baking sheet with parchment paper and set aside.
- Mix Greek yogurt and syrup in a bowl until combined.
- Pour onto prepared baking sheet and spread into a thin layer.
- Top with Blueberry Pecan Granola, blueberries, and strawberries.
- Cover the baking sheet with a piece of aluminum foil. Place in the freezer for two hours, or overnight, until the bar is fully frozen.
- Slice into desired squares. Serve immediately and keep stored in the freezer in an airtight container or bag.

Cheesy Bean Subs



Makes 4 Ingredients

4 White Bread Rolls
1 x 220g Canned Baked Beans
2 Tablespoons Frozen Peas
1/4 cup Grated Cheddar

Method

- Preheat oven to 180°C.
- Use a small serrated knife to remove the tops from rolls, leaving a 1cm-wide border around the edges (do not cut all the way through).
- Combine baked beans and peas in a small bowl.
- 4. Spoon the bean mixture into the bread rolls.
- 5. Place on a baking tray. Top with cheddar.
- 6. Bake for 10 minutes or until crisp and golden.

GARDEN CLUB TIPS & TRICKS

July was cold and frosty and the freezing nights took its toll on many gardens. Best advise for frost damaged plants? If you are unable to move them indoors or to a sheltered area, do not attempt to prune the damaged leaves or stems. Should another cold snap come along, these will actually help to protect the plant. When spring arrives, you will be able to prune the damaged areas and the stems all the way back and they will regrow with the warmer temperatures. However, soft stemmed plants may need to be pruned immediately as their stems are prone to rotting.

August is a good time to clear out your gutters and downpipes – storm season is approaching!

Finish up your mulching and don't forget to feed flowers and winter vegetables with a liquid seaweed or other appropriate fertiliser. Also a complete fertiliser for your citrus to encourage flowering and promote fruit set. Complete planting any bare rooted deciduous trees, shrubs and vines and you can prune roses if you haven't already and any deciduous shrubs or trees to shape them up ready for spring foliage.

Vegetables – with chances of frost still possible it might be best to start your seed sowing in small pots in a warm protected area. Plant tomatoes, capsicums, eggplants, melons, cucumbers, okra and rosellas.

Farmers Invited To Have Their Say In Finding Affordable Electricity Solutions

Food and fibre producers in Queensland and New South Wales are encouraged to share their experiences around securing affordable electricity.

A study looking into options to provide better access to more affordable energy for those on the land is being conducted by Cotton Australia, NSW Irrigators' Council (NSWIC) and Queensland Farmers' Federation (QFF). The study is funded by Energy Consumers Australia as part of its grant process for consumer advocacy and research projects for the benefit of electricity consumers.

The project is exploring the challenges agricultural producers face in installing solar generation assets on farm and their ability to feed excess energy back into the grid. The aim is to better align agricultural energy consumers and network business interests in relation to grid-connected solar on farm and identify possible future opportunities with the network distribution businesses for renewable energy projects through rural Queensland and NSW.

As part of the study, an online survey has been launched and field visits and focus group sessions are to be run in regional areas over the coming month to gather the views and experiences on on-farm solar installation from farmers and irrigators.

"All farmers and irrigators in New South Wales and Queensland can express their views on the barriers to affordable electricity by completing our online survey," Ms Brown says.

"This will help the researchers obtain a solid understanding of the range of energy issues farmers manage, and talk to producers who have installed on-farm solar generation assets or those thinking about doing so."

"We will also run small focus groups in regional areas, and these will complement a number of field visits. This combination will help us thoroughly understand the problems, and, importantly, devise practical and enduring solutions."


