FARM HOUSEHOLD ALLOWANCE - FHA

The FHA will replace the 'Interim Farm Household Allowance' as of the **1**st **July 2014.** From this date the payment can be made to a farmer or the partner of a farmer or be made to each member of the couple individually.

To ensure continuation of the assistance scheme, transitioning from interim to existing, all customers currently receiving the IFHA are required to apply for FHA a dedicated Farmer Assistance Line -

13 23 16.

Customers are encouraged to apply online by registering for online services at www.departmentofhumanservices.gov.au for the FHA but paper forms are available at the Murilla Community Centre.

The FHA provides eligible farmers and their partners (both can apply) assistance and support to help meet their basic household needs.

Customers will need to undertake long term financial activities to assist them improving their financial situation. These activities will be outlined in a Financial Improvement Agreement developed by the customer's Farm Household Case Officer from the Department of Human Services.

FULLY FUNDED TRAINING AVALIABLE

CREDIT REPORTS

Many people do not know that they can request credit reports about their credit rating. You can request these once a year or in the event of; applying and being refused credit in the last 90 days or where your request for access relates to a decision by a Credit Reporting Body or a credit provider to correct information included in your credit report.

There are three main Credit Reporting Bodies (CDB), and no legislation to ensure they hold all the same information, suggesting then you should request one from each.

AGFORCE PROJECTS DELIVERS FREE WEBINAR


AgForce Projects have recognised the need for a free webinar covering information for landholders regarding CSG (Coal Seam Gas) as this will result in less time away from their properties and business.

PRODUCERS CELEBRATE GRAZING BMP MILESTONE IN CQ - AGFORCE PROJECTS

The first graziers in Central Queensland to receive their Grazing Best Management Practice (BMP) Accredited Certification will attend a special presentation dinner in Emerald in October.

Grazing BMP was launched in 2013 to help graziers identify steps to improve the long -term profitability and sustainability of their grazing enterprise.

Property Manager Phil Orchard - Belmont Research Station (Ag-Force owned) says the program is an excellent way to improve his impact on the environment as a grazier and also increase profitability.

"I have been working in the rural and agricultural industry for most of my adult life. Being both a father and grandfather it's very important to me that we leave the environment in a better condition than it is at present for the next generation."

"After taking part in grazing BMP, I have a better understanding of pasture management and the importance of soil structure," says Mr Orchard.

Grazing BMP officer Michael Taylor said "The program which is designed for producers, by producers, helps graziers self-assess and identify opportunities in their current practices to become more sustainable and also demonstrate good environmental and animal stewardship."

Mr Taylor said, "as consumers increasingly demand produce sourced from sustainable production systems, we are confident the industry can utilise the Grazing BMP tool and capture industry progression, foster and support the ongoing development of a sustainable product, and also deliver the

real facts across the whole industry.

The Grazier BMP partnership includes the Fitzroy Basin Association, AgForce and the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry.

Heart of Australia Big Heart Truck visits region

Last month, Mayor Ray Brown, Councillors Carolyn Tillman and Charlene Hall welcomed the Heart of Australia mobile medical service, dubbed the 'Big Heart Truck', to Dalby.

The 25 metre-long, custom-designed, clinic-on-wheels is fully equipped with specialist diagnostic equipment and is an Australian first providing specialist cardiology and respiratory medical services to rural and regional communities.

Its first circuit will see the truck travel in a fortnightly rotation across the Surat Basin. stopping at Dalby, Roma, Charleville, St George and Goondiwindi.

The mobile clinic will next stop in Dalby on Sunday 9 November. Residents wanting to make an appointment with the specialist staff need to obtain a referral from their GP.

REGIONAL FLOOD RECOVERY WORKS CONTINUE

The \$80 million roadworks program, as a part of Council's Regional Flood Recovery Works, to repair damage to regional and rural roads caused by the summer 2010/11 floods and 2012 adverse weather events, including the delivery of several betterment funded projects, was completed on target and on budget. The next stage of the project, to restore road infrastructure networks damaged by the 2013 flood events, is well underway and has an expected completion date of April 2015. PRAISE FOR CHINCHILLA WASTE AND RECYCLING CENTRE

The new Chinchilla Waste and Recycling Centre has been praised by the community for its increased opportunities for recycling and innovative waste management. Residents doubled waste diversion and recycling rates during the transfer stations first month of operation. Throughout the first month 1,673 customers used the state-of-the-art transfer station disposing of more than 1,520 tonnes of waste and diverting 960 tonnes of recyclable waste from landfill. HOUSEHOLD RECYCLING **CONTAMINATION DOWN**

Over the July to September quarter, Western Downs households recycled an average of 4.63 kilograms of recyclable material per week; with only a 10.04 per cent contamination rate of nonrecyclable materials in their yellow-lidded bins. That is a 2.23 per cent drop in contamination from the last quarter. Results from the independent audit show that the most common non-recyclable materials that residents place in their recycling bins is food and kitchen waste, as well as non-recyclable plastics and metals. GAMING AND GAMBLING - NEW RESEARCH

'Teenage fans of video games that stimulate gambling are more likely to convert their habits to real losses according to new research.

A study of the gaming habits of 13 to 17 year olds by the University of Adelaide found more than a quarter of teens have played gambling-style video games, while nearly 1 in 10 have played gambling games on social media, and about one in 20 had played these games on a mobile phone.

A small number, around 2% said they had tried to gamble with real money on the internet.

Dr Daniel King from the School of Psychology led the research.

Dr King said, "one of the problems with the non financial gambling games is that they give the wrong impression about gambling, they misrepresent the odds," and that he tried to loose money and found it to be impossible.

Many free gambling games have appeal for a youth audience and include advertisements for real gambling sites, often with no barriers for entry.

Dr King said "there's no age verification, there is no data coming out (from the) industry whether young people are using these apps."

The youth service last year conducted a study of available research into the impact of video games on young people. It found 94% of 6 - 15 year olds play video games and between 3% - 15% could be characterised as addicted.

Study author and Manager of Manningham

YMCA Youth Services, Steven Dupon said excessive use of video games has been linked to mental health issues, in particular depression and anxiety.

Mr Dupon stressed they were not antigaming, instead they wanted to minimise any harmful effects of gaming on young people. '

MEMOIRS OF THE MILES HISTORICAL VILLAGE, EDITION 5- BY JOYCE DAVIDSON

In 1974 the eastern and southern veranda of the Shell House were enclosed and ceiled by Don Duffel to form the Shell House Annex, it was painted by Joyce and Doris Davidson and Lloyd Bell.

The additional glass cases were made by Les Rose and Co, in which to display more of Mr and Mrs Morgan's Shell collection and were paid for by Mr Morgan at a cost of \$1,500. Once again both Mr and Mrs Morgan spent days sorting these shells and meticulously typing tags and naming shells.

On the 5th October 1974, the third anniversary of the Miles Museum, the annex was officially opened by the Honourable W.A.R Rae, Minister for Lands. The opening was followed by a damper making competition, and was won by Brian Ford. The fastest Quart Pot was won by David Mundell.

Afternoon tea consisting of Damper and syrup along with Billy tea was served to the many visitors.



At a meeting in 1975 it was decided that no settlement would be complete without a village store. Ella Robinson, who owned the old Hunter Store in Jackson, had offered the glass windows, and ply wood ceiling to the museum. Joyce and Doris Davidson travelled to Jackson and removed the ceiling, they were really covered in rat poo as they removed the sheets of ply.

Unfortunately the glass from the windows was stacked for removal, but during a heat wave it broke into pieces. The plywood was transported to the Museum, and used to ceil the store built by Don Duffel. It was also used for many other

projects - bottoms of glass cases etc.

The store was painted by Joyce and Doris Davidson. The polished counter was part of the original counter of the Hunters store in Miles, and was donated by John Cadzow, the counter was cleaned and polished by Doris Davidson.

Sawn slabs in the front of the store depicts the cattle brands of early settlers, amongst those is the brand of William Miles, after whom the town was named. This brand was burned in by his granddaughter.

The store features goods of bygone days, with the old weights of pounds and ounces depicted on each article.

On the 28th September 1975, the fourth anniversary of the Miles Museum, the store was opened by Brian Powell, Manager of the Queensland Government Travel Centre, in Toowoomba.



It was at a meeting in 1975, that the idea of a village street was mooted, and that a residence in Constance Street (Miles) resembled the 1882 old Union Hotel of Christy Andersen, and if we could raise the money, we were to go ahead and purchase the building. It was purchased for \$1,500 and Mr Harrison removed it to the complex.

Unfortunately there was an issue with the workmanship and words were exchanged and Father Leahy ended up digging the holes for the buildings stumps.

Doris assisted Don Duffel moving the partitions, and a Barber shop, Bar, Dining Room, Kitchen, Bedroom and Bathroom resulted. The entire building was then painted by Joyce and Doris Davidson, assisted by Mrs Sturrock who applied an artistic finish to the windows and doors.





The Barber's shop featured a barber's chair donated by Brian Ford, along with other barbering tools of the trade. The walls were lined with racing photos presented by Mr. Godfrey Morgan, along with sporting trophies from various donors. The shelves in the Bar are lined with an assortment of bottles by a friend of Mr Morgan's from Taroom.

Behind the linoleum topped bar counter (donated by Joyce and Doris Davidson), the Barman (manikin) wearing a vest and apron, waiting to pour a drop for patrons, stands in front of the mirrored back drop donated by Brian Ford.

In the dining room, is a table set with a damask cloth and bentwood chairs, china and

starched serviettes, bentwood chairs, china and cutlery of a bygone era. The waitress (manikin) dressed in Black, with starched white apron with white collar and cuffs, stands anxiously waiting for customers. Both manikins are dressed in clothes made by Joyce and Doris Davidson.



The kitchen has a wood burning stove, a dresser



purchased and donated by Joyce Davidson, at a cost of \$10.00. A double bed, a wardrobe, a washstand, and dutchess much of which was donated by Brian Ford is featured in the bedroom.

The bathroom was lined with rippled iron, and has a tin bath and chip heaters. Unfortunately items began to disappear, so it became necessary to have grills affixed for security - this was done by Bob Cochrane.

On Saturday 25th September 1976 the Hotel was officially opened by The Honourable K.B Tomkins M.L.A member of this Electorate, State Minister of Lands.

The Hotel Bar did a great trade on opening day, as did the barber Mr Lisle Thomas, of Toowoomba.

Mr Duncan Sturrock, Chairman of the Murilla Shire Council was the first in a long line of patrons queuing for haircuts.

During October the Murilla Garden group visited the garden of Richard & Lois Roberts. Unfortunately I was unable to attend, however the feedback states it was a fantastic day. Heritage roses were the main feature of the spectacular

garden and beautiful lawns with immaculate gardens and surrounds.

Lois spoke of her seedling roses that she has been propagating creating, new varieties and naming them after the grandchildren.

This garden is one I would love to visit one day. We would like to wish the Roberts family all the best for their family reunion.

Christmas will be upon us before we know it, one thing that happens a lot around this time of year is entertaining.

Now is probably a great time if you wanted to add extra colour to your garden and summer entertaining areas is to plant in some colourful annuals.

Petunia's don't require a lot of water, and are vigorous growers. There are two main types of petunia's; Grandiflora petunias which have large flowers and are best grown in containers or hanging baskets, whereas multiflora petunias have smaller, but more abundant flowers and are ideal for summer bedding or borders.

Marigolds with their rich yellow, cream, lemon, gold, orange and reddish-brown flowers are great plants for brightening the garden. They are excellent massed in a bold display on their own, or a mixed display. Marigolds are also popular in the vegetable garden for use as companion plants, because their pungent foliage deters insects, and the roots discourage soil-dwelling nematodes. Marigolds are extremely easy to grow, but do like full sun to reach their full potential.

Zinnias are another great annual; they grow quickly, and bloom heavily. They make a massive burst of colour in your garden. Zinnias have bright, solitary, daisy-like flower heads on a single, straight stem.

Salvia's grow in a sunny location in well-drained soil. Salvias are dry tolerant once established and look wonderful in beds, borders or dry gardens. They have a vigorous growth and are easy care.

Keep in mind when planting flowers out in pots that it is a busy time of year, if you are going to be away a lot or too busy to water regularly, self-watering pots would be the better option. They are designed to save water and time. Water is stored in the reservoir at the bottom. Some use a wicking action to draw up the water, and some just use the



As the heat is ramping up pay special attention to soil moisture levels, renew mulches and keep an eye on seedlings.

If you can, apply liquid fertiliser to green vegies at least once a fortnight. This will keep them pumping along nicely.

Things to plant are capsicums, chillies, celery, leeks, lettuce, silverbeet, pumpkins, rockmelon's and eggplant.

You also might be able to get in that second crop of corn and zucchini.



MILES NILS UPDATE - BUDGET ASSESSMENT

Taking clients through the NILS process requires applicants to think about their household expenditure.

Through this process clients can understand how money is being spent and potentially where savings can be made. In some situations your basic living costs For some, this may be the first time they have considered their expenditure in any detail.

Αt this point applicants may also . understand the disadvantage of high cost payday loans which they may have used.

Where do I start on a budget? A budget doesn't need to be comprehensive; it can be a simple tool that helps you keep track of your living expenses.

A majority of the household income is spent on shopping and regular bills, also known as your basic living costs.

A great tool that is easy to use is the "Me & My Money" handbook that is available at the Murilla Community Centre or online at www.humanservices.gov.au/spw/ customer/publications/resources/ cs1143/cs1143-0606en.pdf

It is a simple but effective budgeting booklet that will assist in developing a budget. Here are some simple steps from "Me & My Money" to help prepare and use a budget:

- Decide who you need to include in your budget (if you have children, even if they do not live with you fulltime).
- Ensure all income streams are included. Only include overtime pay if it is regular.
- Determine the expenses associated with basic living costs. Some costs unavoidable, for example, essentials like food, housing and clothing.
- Separate shopping from bills shopping consists of food and drink, house and garden, clothing.

- Regular bills include: insurance, phone, electricity and car.
- It can be difficult to remember all of vour bills. A good way is to go through old receipts, bank and credit card statements.
- Any money left over after expenses can be put towards your savings.

may be higher than your income. At this stage the following tips may help relieve financial pressure:

- Are there any bills that can be paid off over time?
- Can expenses be cut down ie. lunches instead of buying, take a shopping list and calculator to the grocery shopping
- Can I earn more money.

"Me & My Money" is a practical money ideas booklet which has simple tools and templates that can be used to establish an effective budget.






