Miles Historical Village Museum's Afternoon Anniversarv presents Ghosts of Gallipoli' on the 12th September 2015. This is a presentation of stories of soldiers (born in the area or enlisted in Miles) who served at Gallipoli.

research has identified 13 of these men who served at Gallipoli in 1915. You will hear the stories of Charles Parish, Douglas Handford, Edward Stevenson, William Fennelly, James Suley, Hugh Hagan, Frederick Ratcliff, Eric Newberry, William Burrow, John Kennedy, John Williams, Arthur McGrath and Thomas Walker. Of the 13 men, 7 survived the war; 3 died at Gallipoli and 3

in France after surviving Gallipoli. The Miles Historical Village War Museum is very excited to have on display a 100 year old letter written by Thomas Walker while he has servina at Gallipoli during anniversary day celebrations.



Thomas Walker unfortunately did not make it home and was killed at Gallipoli on the 11th of September 1915.

ACCELERATED DEPRECIATION FOR PRIMARY PRODUCERS

In the 2015 - 2016 Federal Budget, the government announced that it will allow primary producers to;

- immediately deduct the cost of fencing and water facilities
- depreciate over three years the cost of fodder storage asset

Under previous arrangements, primary producers can claim a deduction for the decline in value of;

- Fences over a period of 30 years
- Water facilities over three years
- Fodder storage assets over a period up to 50 years

This measure applies to eligible assets and expenditure incurred from 7.30pm (AEST) 12 May 2015. The government has also announced changes accelerated depreciation for small allow those businesses with aggregated annual turnover of less than \$2 million to immediately deduct each asset that costs less than \$20,000. The Department of Human Services - Centrelink, Medicare and Child Support now require you to create an online account





MEMOIRS OF THE MILES HISTORICAL VILLAGE, EDITION 12

In 1983 the Western Skillion of the Columboola Hall was cemented by Don Duffel assisted by Lloyd Bell and Doris Davidson.


In 1984, an office, souvenir shop and kiosk were erected by Les Rose and Co and was in use until 1990. Joyce and Doris Davidson obtained inlaid lino from Telecom in 1982 (when automation came to town. This was on the proviso they rolled it up and removed it from Telecom). They floored the kiosk and photographic room with it. When Morgan place was built outside the kiosk,


and garden pots established, the rain water could not run away. Twice the kiosk flooded. Joyce and Doris Davidson had to move heavy items and take up the lino and dry it out. This occurred twice until the Council made alterations to the gardens allowing the water to escape.


Also in 1984 the first booklet of the Museum was made by Mr Allen Davis. Later Wespac bank sponsored several booklets, with Joyce and Doris Davison supplying photographs.

On the 26th January 1984 a pictorial post marker was introduced at the Miles Post Office for the first time. It featured a view of the Historical Village street. To mark the occasion special first day covers depicting a view of the village were issued by the Historical Society. During 1984 the Historical Village was also made the Tourist Information Centre.

During the same year, a replica of the Red Rose Café was erected in the village to honour the early Greek Café proprietors (who travelled from their homeland and established Cafés in Western Queensland). The first Greek Café in Miles was built by Mr Jack Faros in 1925 in Train Street now known as Murilla Street. The replica was built by Les Rose and Co. The Wunderlich ceiling was donated by David and Margaret Watts (this was originally in Morgan and Kay (Elders) stock and station agents). Les Rose removed the ceiling and reinstalled it in the replica. Doris Davidson obtained and donated scrolls for the awning posts. Mr Harry Smith from Chinchilla donated the soda fountain, but lo and behold white ants had eaten all the inside timber support. Don Duffel and Bob Cochrane rebuilt it using soft pine timber from Joyce and Doris Davidson. Doris Davidson made all the café tables using the backs of the seats from the Majestic Café and Don Duffel made the legs.



Those strong August winds we get can be extremely damaging to plants, remember to stake anything that could snap off or fall over. Wind breaks could also be set up for young plants. Be careful when staking, make sure you are not going to affect the root system. I have killed a few plants over time by hammering in the stake too close to the main stem of the plant. Around a foot away from the plant should be safe enough. Insert the stake on the side of the prevailing wind so that the plant is blown away from the stake, this way the plant won't rub on the stake. Use something strong but soft to tie the plant so there is no



damage the trunk, or cut through. I have used rags in the past ripped into long pieces, bicycle inner tubes and pantyhose work well. Staking newly planted trees that have been grown in a pot or bag, is necessary to prevent the tree from rocking in the wind and movement of the roots, which could harm the root system and slow down establishment. If you have newly planted something that is quite tall from a pot, double staking would probably be necessary. This can be done by inserting two to three stakes opposite each other and evenly spaced around the tree, outside of where the roots are, then tying off to each stake from the trunk. Allow some movement of the plant, if you keep it too immobilised it could weaken the plant; it needs to be able to bend and flex a little so the roots and trunk grow stronger.

With Spring not too far away, it is a good time to start fertilising, adding compost and manures around plants so as they have got plenty of feed and are ready for when the weather warms up and the new growth begins to appear. I get the itch to start pruning off the effects of frost on shrubs, but I try to wait until I know that the frosts have gone for the year before I do so.

IN THE VEGGIE PATCH

Winter vegies are coming to an end. If you have any bare patches in the vegie garden you could direct seed some bock choy, spinach, parsnips, carrots, beetroot and spring onions. If you have a hot house or are able to construct a simple one out of a polystyrene box and a bit of glass or a plastic storage box, you could sow seeds of some frost tender vegetables, to get in early for spring such as corn, basil, capsicum and cucumber. Just be sure that you check them every day as some hot days can easily dry out and cook the seedlings, very quickly.





TIGER PEAR, DECLARED WEED OF NATIONAL SIGNIFICANCE

Tiger pear is a Class 2 declared pest plant in Queensland and is very difficult to control. The local infestation is believed to have escaped from the garden of one of the original homesteads in the Miles area.

This multi-branched perennial cactus grows up to 60cm high, has yellow flowers and infrequently has red fruit. The numerous sharp 1-3cm spines are rapidly embedded in skin and are painful and difficult to remove (most cattle and dogs don't have pliers).

Dense infestations form impenetrable spiny groundcover that increases grazing pressure and causes erosion due to stock movement being restricted to clear areas.

It drastically reduces the carrying capacity of land and further devalues production by causing lesions in the hides of livestock.

Tiger pear is disbursed by segments readily detaching and being transported by creeks, flood water, adhering to animal skin or hair, clothing and vehicle tyres. It grows anywhere a segment contacts the ground. Like most weeds it establishes readily on bare ground or disturbed areas.

Tiger pear is a native of Argentina and is now a serious pest in Australia and South Africa. The most effective control strategy in both countries is Tiger pear Cochineal **Dactylopius austrinus**, a sap sucking mealy bug introduced from Argentina to Australia in 1932. It is host specific and highly effective on dense infestations. Under favourable conditions it rapidly reduces Tiger Pear populations. Cochineal is most effective on dense infestations where grass is plentiful to assist insect movement between plants.

When conditions are dry and therefore less favourable for Cochineal, or where infestations are lighter, manual mechanical removal is recommended.

The Cactoblastis moth is another important bio control agent which disburses more readily to other plants. In surveys of affected properties in the Murilla Landcare area significant damage to some Tiger pear was observed from Cactoblastis moth larvae.

An integrated approach is recommended for long term control. Dense infestations are best treated by biological control agents while rainfall and humidity is higher.

Western Downs Regional Council is currently breeding Cochineal for distribution for local infestations; please contact either Murilla Landcare or Western Downs Regional Council for more information. For smaller scattered infestations manual removal and burning with hot fire is recommended. The deliberate burning of larger affected areas may provide assistance in controlling tiger pear populations and reduce the amount of management effort required.

Before burning, consider whether fire is suitable for your pasture, land management practices and current seasonal conditions. Consult your local fire warden to obtain a fire permit before lighting fires.



The Miles Lions Club has had a rich history and a strong involvement in the community over the 50 years.

The Miles Lions first fundraiser was held on Sunday 17th April 1966, and proved to be a fantastic and successful event. The Miles Lions Air Pageant attracted over 2000 people and made a profit of \$1100, a wonderful achievement for the first fundraiser by the club, not to mention an Air Pageant is not an easy feat to organise.

In 1965 the club held an Australian record of having a father and his two sons as active members of the

Lions Club - Congratulations Stan Macaulay and son's Mal and Ian. In 1973 the Miles Leo Club was formed - aiming to give young people 16 - 25 years the opportunity to gain experience and develop leadership in community service. Between 1981 and 1982 the Miles Lions dedicated many hours of fundraising, time and human power to build the Senior Citizens Building. A continuing tradition is that on the fourth Wednesday of the month the Lions provide a home cooked dinner for the seniors. In 1983 the Lions donated in excess of \$6680 to local charities, \$3000 of which went to the retirement village.




